

Smestow School Pupil Premium 2019-20 IMPACT

Allocation = £276'293 for the year 2019-20

Our Academy had 868 students on roll in Year 7 to 13, 36% (360 students) of these were eligible for Pupil Premium Funding. The information that follows demonstrates the impact of our work with disadvantaged students in 2019-20.

This cohort of students was significantly affected by the national lockdown which began on 23/3/20 – as such many aspects of the action plan and attached funding were unrealised. By means of an illustration the below are examples of planned intervention which we were unable to implement due to the national lockdown and subsequent cancellation of the summer exams:

- Revision packs for all PP students including stationery.
- Access to specialist mentoring to identify and remove barriers to learning for PP students.
- Tailored careers advice from Connexions for our Y11 PP students was due to take place just after the Easter break and was not possible.
